

To strategically plan for major changes in an organizational setting, it is helpful to know the process that each person goes through while responding to change. While the intensity of each person's responses may vary, the nature of each stage is typical for everyone. Even if the change is positive or chosen, one may still feel some kind of loss. It is a big mistake to underestimate how a major change can influence people's attitudes and productivity. Some managers mistakenly feel that if they tell an employee to change, he/she will do so automatically, without consequence.

To create common principles about leading change, seminar participants will read Patrick Lencioni's Five Dysfunctions of a Team, which is a compelling, smart, quick and easy-to-read fable about how Kathryn, the manager in the story, overcomes anger and resistance to change and makes her team high performing. The book is included in the seminar cost.

 - 1. Denial/anger
 - 2. Resistance/acceptance
 - 3. Resolution/acceptance
 - 4. Commitment
- Learn effective strategies for helping individuals and teams deal with change

- Learn how mental models impact people's attitudes toward change
- Practice "Stop, Challenge and Choose" to interpret change differently to get preferred results

The seminar employs a balance of content and process and a blended approach to learning. This involves experience-based learning, brief lecture, and small and large group conversations. Methodologies are highly interactive and address different learning styles. Group process exercises and presentations are offered to maximize individual and group learning.
